The board of directors of CHAMP Camp is comprised of passionate and caring individuals with a diverse skill set to meet the organizational needs. Board meetings are held on the second Thursday of the month, every other month. An annual meeting is held in January to approve the annual budget, elect new officers and set the goals and objectives based on our three-year strategic plan. Board members serve a term of three years and may serve no more than three consecutive terms. Officers of the executive committee serve for two years. Transitions off the board are staggered to ensure that a historical perspective remains as we add new members. After one year away from the board, past members may request to be considered to be a part of the board if their skill set would complement the current board.




HISTORY OF CHAMP CAMP

CHAMP Camp, Inc. began in early 1991, born from the vision of David Carter, a hospital administrator with a background in respiratory therapy, and Nancy McCurdy, a child life specialist. They sought to create a summer overnight camping experience for children with tracheostomies and those requiring ventilator or technological assistance. Working closely with children in hospital settings, many of whom had quadriplegia, David and Nancy recognized the need to provide opportunities for these young people to fully experience and enjoy life beyond their medical challenges.

Due to the medical fragility and around-the-clock care required by children living on ventilators, traditional camp programs were not an option. Determined to make the outdoors accessible to these potential campers, David and Nancy discovered that only a few camps in the country served this unique population. In May 1991, a Steering Committee was formed to bring their dream to life.

With the strong logistical support of Lifelines Children's Rehabilitation Hospital, once located in central Indiana, and financial gifts from individuals and several businesses in the community, a weekend pilot program was launched at Camp Isanogel in Muncie, Indiana, in August 1991. The inaugural camp was filled with unforgettable and exciting experiences. In 1992, the camp moved to Bradford Woods in Martinsville, Indiana, and by 1993, CHAMP Camp found a new home at Recreation Unlimited in Ashley, Ohio, just north of Columbus. Over time, the camp grew steadily, welcoming campers from 13 states.



In the summer of 1998, CHAMP Camp expanded its offerings to include enrichment experiences tailored to the evolving needs of adolescents. By 2011, the camp returned to Bradford Woods, bringing it back to its Indiana roots.

The program has evolved remarkably over the years. Activities now include canoeing, climbing a 50-foot alpine tower, fishing, swimming, creative arts, recreational games, outdoor living skills, pontoon boating, zip lining and exploring the camp's extraordinary treehouse. Thanks to our dedicated volunteer staff - composed primarily of healthcare professionals - all activities and equipment are carefully adapted to ensure full camper participation. CHAMP Camp truly embodies a "can-do" spirit.

CHAMP Camp was officially incorporated on August 23, 1991, and is a recognized nonprofit with 501(c)(3) status, allowing for tax-deductible donations. The camp is funded through the generosity of individuals, corporations, foundation grants, and special events, including the annual Silver Sneaker Benefit Ball.

We look forward to continuing to add to our rich history during our 36th year of camp in June of 2026!

THE HIGHLIGHTS



35 YEARS OF CAMP

We can't believe we celebrated our 35th year of camp in 2025! Over the past three and a half decades, CHAMP Camp has experienced many changes. We graduated multiple campers, moved locations several times and survived a pandemic that required us to hold camp virtually in 2020 and 2021. While we weren't sure how strong our return would be, the CHAMP Camp spirit came back stronger than ever in 2022!

To mark this milestone, we added several special touches to our celebration. Our commemorative T-shirt featured a "Once Upon a Time" theme that represented camp throughout the years. Cabins fully embraced the fantasy with dragons, princesses and plenty of whimsy.

Our ever-popular dance became an even bigger hit with the addition of a carnival style food truck. We are so grateful for Shaggy's Concessions who were able to adapt to our crazy weather conditions and still provide delicious treats and drinks!

We invited our founders, Dave Carter and Nancy McCurdy, along with alumni campers to join us for a birthday party at the lake. We wore party hats, enjoyed Qdoba and cupcakes-in-a-jar, and reminisced about the years with a banner portraying all of our camp T-shirts throughout the years.

We can't wait to see what the next 35 years bring!

COUNSELORS AND CANOES

No birthday celebration would be complete without the first annual (maybe last annual?) counselor canoe race! Cabins were challenged to create their own canoe oars using pool noodles, duct tape, and whatever natural materials they could find nearby. The creativity on display, including one clever decoy oar, made it clear this would be a race for the ages!

Two counselors were selected to represent each cabin, and the competitive energy was evident from the beginning as canoes leapt from the start line. The race quickly turned into an epic showdown between our two boys' cabins, Raymond and Elm as they sprinted to the turn around point and headed for the finish line.

It looked like Elm would take the win, but a challenge from Raymond resulted in Elm's disqualification missing the turn around. Walnut and Beech put up a strong fight, but unfortunately Oak ended up in the lake!

While inside the bubble, he was finally able to experience it for himself, putting his face "in" the water and see what he had been curious about for so long.

The night ended with a lively auction led by Darin Lawson and energetic dancing with DJ SLMBR! We are grateful to all who attended, including the many campers and counselors who joined the celebration.

TAYLA


Glitter, Tiaras, and a Smile that will Brighten Your Day! written by Amy Beal, Tayla's Awesome Mom!

He was so fun and enthusiastic, Tayla instantly connected with him. Dr. Chuck told us about CHAMP Camp and encouraged us to come check it out that summer.

We made the 2 1/2 hour trip to camp, and Tayla was hooked! She had never been around other kids like her and seeing all the fun they were having filled her with excitement. As soon as we left, we basically started the counting down the days until the next summer!

CHAMP Camp is always the highlight of Tayla's year. During her first year at camp the counselors sprayed her hair pink. You could still see pink at Christmas, and Tayla loved it. The counselors were extremely apologetic and worried that it wouldn't wash out. Little did they know that it would start a tradition. Almost every summer before CHAMP camp we color Tayla's hair pink! Camp lets her show off how ornery and adventurous she can be. She embraces her inner dare devil while doing things like zipline, alpine tower climbing, and even going up in a hot air balloon. Tayla loves the freedom to be independent and on her own at camp.

For our family, this time is just as meaningful. Camp is the only time when we are not providing overnight care for Tayla. It allows us to truly recharge and one-on-one time with her siblings, doing activities that are not always accessible to her, while knowing Tayla is safe, supported, and having the time of her life.

I first learned about CHAMP Camp while attending a Purdue Timmy Global Health meeting where Dr. Chuck was speaking. Another member had attended the year before and highly recommended it, but I was unable to apply that summer due to scheduling conflicts.

The following semester, I joined Engineering Projects in Community Service worked on a team partnered with Bradford Woods to help design an accessible treehouse for their camps. When CHAMP Camp was mentioned again, I knew it was time to listen, and I applied to be a counselor that summer as a pre-med student. I had an amazing week and loved how hands-on I was able to be with campers in the cabins.

CHAMP Camp has brought so much joy to my summers and made me a better Physician Assistant to my patients during the rest of the year. It is rewarding to help provide some of the same core childhood memories to these special kids that I made attending summer camps. My time at CHAMP Camp also helped me stand out during clinical rotations, as I was already comfortable with feeding tubes, trachs, and complex medical care, experiences many students don't receive until they enter the field.

Now, as a provider, I try not to put any limits on my patients as CHAMP Camp has expanded my perspective of what is possible. Instead, I listen to each person's goals and find safe, creative ways to help them achieve what matters most to them. I've become a better communicator and have learned how to fully utilize each of the talents and unique roles of all the allied healthcare professionals.

Seeing the treehouse design finally come to life reminded me how thankful I am that CHAMP camp came into my life all those years ago. No matter the role I've held or the cabin I've been assigned, there has been a sense of belonging that keeps calling me back, even after moving away to New York!


Eric Huebner From Event Guest to Board Member
